1914

### Lieutenant Maurice Dease V.C.

**Royal Fusiliers. He died on August 23rd at Mons, aged 24.**

**He was awarded the first V.C. in the First World War for his bravery at the Battle of Mons. He came from County Westmeath, Ireland and attended Stonyhurst School.**

**He was the nephew of William and Clementina Mostyn of Benwell House,  
Woodchester.**

**Captain George R. Wyld.**

3<sup>rd</sup> Battalion, Wiltshire Regiment. He died on 24<sup>th</sup> December aged 37.

Rifleman, 9th London Regiment, Queen Victoria's Rifles. Service No. 1611.,  
*This memorial has him as Lieutenant but all records show him as Rifleman. The memorial gives 1916*

**Rifleman Francis E. Partridge.,**

3<sup>rd</sup> Battalion, Kings Royal Rifle Corps Service No 8299. He died on 15th February

**Lance Corporal Albert Child**

1<sup>st</sup>/2<sup>nd</sup> Battalion, Worcestershire Regiment. Service No. 119. He died on March 13<sup>th</sup>, aged 22.

**Private James Campbell**

13th Cheshire Regiment Service No. 753. He died of wounds in Stroud hospital on 14 April 1915.

**Private Aloysius Mobley.**

5<sup>th</sup> Battalion, Gloucestershire Regiment Service No 2229. He died on 5<sup>th</sup> May aged 24

**Private Frederick Alder.**

1st Battalion, Gloucestershire Regiment. He died on May 9<sup>th</sup>, aged 35

**Private Alfred William Hyde.**

1st Battalion, Gloucestershire Regiment. Service No. 2002.

**Stephen Ealey.**

Misspelt as "Caley" on the memorial, believed to be Stephen Ealey from Horsley. He died May 10<sup>th</sup>.

**Private William E. Holbrow (Holborow)**

2<sup>nd</sup> Battalion, Gloucestershire Regiment. Service No. 10081. ]

**Private William C. Richings.**

2<sup>nd</sup> Battalion, Grenadier Guards. Service No 15172. He was killed in action on May 17<sup>th</sup> aged 21.

**Private William Leonard Stevens\_(or Stephens)**

10<sup>th</sup> or 2<sup>nd</sup> Battalion, Gloucestershire Regiment. Service No. 9195. *The memorial gives the year as 1916.*

**Private Bert Harrison.**

4<sup>th</sup> Worcestershire Regiment. Service No. 10296. He died of his wounds May 31<sup>st</sup> aged 29.  
*The wrong date, June 6<sup>th</sup> 1916, is on the memorial.*

**Private Harold Vincent (Jack) Angell**

5th Battalion, Gloucestershire Regiment. Service No. 2426. He died of wounds on June 13<sup>th</sup> aged 18.

**Sergeant Edward Davies.**

9<sup>th</sup> Battalion, Gloucestershire Regiment. Service No. 2717

**Engine Room Artificer Alfred Hunt.**

Royal Navy Submarine Company 33. He died on August 5<sup>th</sup> aged 29

**2nd Lieutenant Geoffrey R. Johnson.**

7th Battalion, Gloucestershire Regiment. He died of his wounds on August 7<sup>th</sup> aged 23  
(*The GWGC has 22* )

**Private Laurence N. Wilkinson.**

5th Battalion, Shropshire Regiment. Service No. 16156. He died on September 15<sup>th</sup>.

**Private G.H.Hanks.**

10th Battalion, Gloucestershire Regiment. Service No. 17385. He died on September 25<sup>th</sup> aged 35

**Private Edward E. Leigh**

1st Battalion, South Wales Borderers Service No 6828. He died on September 26<sup>th</sup> aged 32.  
*The T.N.A. has his rank as Lance Corporal.*

**Corporal Wallace W. Grey**

10<sup>th</sup> Battalion, Gloucestershire Regiment. Service No. 13621. He died of his wounds on September 27<sup>th</sup> aged 21.

**Private (Ernest) Edward Cuss.**

1<sup>st</sup> Battalion, Gloucestershire Regiment. Service No. 18815. He died of his wounds on October 9<sup>th</sup>, aged 24. *His date is given as October 11<sup>th</sup> on the memorial.*

**Sergeant Thomas Wyndham Trussler.**

10<sup>th</sup> Battalion, Gloucestershire Regiment. Service No. 12451. He was born in Mells Somerset, enlisted in Stroud and died of his wounds on October 27<sup>th</sup> aged 21. He was the brother of Albert and Percy both of whom fell and are remembered on this memorial

**Private Charles Edward Bingle**

8<sup>th</sup> Battalion, Gloucestershire Regiment. Service No.13664. He was killed in action November 3rd aged 22.

**Sapper Ralph John Dee.**

70th Field Company, Royal Engineers. Service No. 42073. He died on December 8<sup>th</sup> aged 19

**Private Walter Ernest Davis.**

12<sup>th</sup> Battalion, Gloucestershire Regiment. Service No. 14491. He died of his wounds on December 31<sup>st</sup>. aged 34.

**Corporal Herbert (Hubert?) W. Cox.**

8<sup>th</sup> Battalion, Gloucestershire Regiment. Service No. 17674. He was born in Gloucester and enlisted in Stroud and died of his wounds on January 4<sup>th</sup> aged 27.

**Ernest Charles Beale.**

Driver, 119097, 18<sup>th</sup> Reserve, Royal Field Artillery. He died in Exeter Isolation Hospital of meningitis on 7<sup>th</sup> February aged 19

**2nd Lieutenant Lionel Palling.**

Royal Fusiliers. He was killed in action on March 15<sup>th</sup>.

**Private Charles Stewart Strange.**

Assistant Paymaster, 41 H.M.T. President, Royal Navy. He died on April 22nd 1916 age 32

**Sergeant Frank Smith.**

7<sup>th</sup> Battalion, Gloucestershire Regiment. Service No. 8310 He was killed in action in Mesopotamia on April 23<sup>rd</sup> (*or 21<sup>st</sup>*), aged 29.

**Private Harry Malpas.**

16<sup>th</sup> Battalion, Cheshire Regiment Service No 21821. He died on April 28<sup>th</sup> age 23.

**Corporal Walter Fruin.**

10<sup>th</sup> Battalion, Gloucestershire Regiment. Service No. 12430. He was born in Woodchester enlisted in Stroud and died of his wounds on April 30<sup>th</sup> aged 20.

**Captain Eric Maudslay Simpson.**

9<sup>th</sup> Battalion, Worcestershire Regiment. He died on May 2<sup>nd</sup> aged 34.

**Private Harry Bristow**

6<sup>th</sup> Battalion, Dorset Regiment Service No 15856. He died on May 5<sup>th</sup> aged 22.

*The "UK, Soldiers Died in the Great War" names him Henry*

**Private Henry Middleditch.**

1/5<sup>th</sup> Gloucestershire Regiment. He was killed in action on May 13<sup>th</sup> aged 21.

**Charles Holbrow (Holborow)**

Stoker 1<sup>st</sup> Class, HMS Black Prince, Royal Navy. Service No.K/23928 He was lost with HMS Black Prince on May 31<sup>st</sup>, aged 20.

**Ernest Lloyd**

Cameron Highlanders. He died on June 4<sup>th</sup>, aged 40. He may be the following.

*Private, 43rd Canadian Infantry (Manitoba Regiment) Cameron Highlanders of Canada Service No.153355. He died on 3rd June 1916, aged 41. He was the husband of Ellen Lloyd of 4, Pretoria Terrace, Alston Croft, Cheltenham, and son of Albert and Jane of Cheltenham. His birth name was Ernest Albert born 1875. He is buried at Perth Cemetery, China Wall, Belgium. He may have left his wife and children after the 1911 census and enlisted in Manitoba as Ernest Blick. He deducted 6 years from his age presumably so he would be accepted. He also claimed to be single and gave his next of kin as his married sister who lived in Cheltenham.*

**Sergeant George Edward Wright**

12<sup>th</sup> Royal Rifle Brigade. Service No. S/3589. He was killed in action on June 6<sup>th</sup>, aged 27

*The memorial has his date as June 7<sup>th</sup>.*

**Corporal Henry (Harry) Edward Smith.**

1<sup>st</sup> Battalion, Gloucestershire Regiment. Service No. 1457. He was born in Minchinhampton enlisted in Stroud and killed in action on June 9<sup>th</sup> aged 22.

**Private Charles Henry (Franklin) Harding.**

1<sup>st</sup> Battalion, Gloucestershire Regiment. Service No. 2010. He had two names. He was born in Exeter enlisted in Stroud and was killed in action on June 10<sup>th</sup> aged 20.

**Corporal Leonard Coverdale.**

12<sup>th</sup> Battalion, York & Lancaster Regiment. Service No 121626. He died aged 25 on July 1<sup>st</sup>, the first day of the Somme

**Private Eric Martin**

10<sup>th</sup> Queen's Own Royal West Kent Regiment, formerly 12820, 25 Border regiment. Service no. G/16342. He died on July 1<sup>st</sup> aged 24 (*or 25*)

**Corporal Wilfred James Brinkworth**

8<sup>th</sup> Battalion, Gloucestershire Regiment. Service No. 13656. He was born in Woodchester, enlisted in Stroud and killed in action on July 3<sup>rd</sup> aged 22.

*He is named James on the Wayside Cross.*

**Private Percy F. Click.**

8th Battalion, Gloucestershire Regiment. Service No 13053. He was killed in action on July

**3<sup>rd</sup> Lieutenant Richard William Jennings.**



**“C” Company 10<sup>th</sup> Battalion, Worcestershire Regiment. He died of his wounds which he received at La Boisselle on July 3<sup>rd</sup> aged 27. He was rescued from the battlefield by Private Thomas Turrell, who received the Victoria Cross. He was the son of Rev Arthur Charles and Georgina Isabella Jennings of King’s Stanley Rectory. He was Cambridge Lightweight Boxing Champion 1909-1910: B.A and L.L.B [Cantab]. He was entered on the Roll of Solicitors July. He is buried at Meaulte Military Cemetery, France. He was mentioned in despatches.**

**Lance Corporal Wallace Charles Marsh.**

8<sup>th</sup> Battalion, Gloucestershire Regiment. Service No 13654 He was born in Amberley enlisted in Stroud and killed in action on July 3<sup>rd</sup> aged 30

**Private Rollo Peter Steele.**

9<sup>th</sup> Battalion, Manchester Regiment, previously East Surrey Regiment. Service No. 17657. He died on July 14<sup>th</sup> aged 21.

**Private Ernest Mills.**

5<sup>th</sup> Battalion, Gloucestershire Regiment. Service No. 2856. He was born in Stroud enlisted in Gloucester and killed in action on July 23<sup>rd</sup>

**Private William Pash.**

10<sup>th</sup> Battalion Gloucestershire Regiment. Service No. 24313. He was born and enlisted in Nailsworth and was killed in action on July 23<sup>rd</sup>, aged 20.

**Sergeant William Henry Mills.**

10<sup>th</sup> Battalion, Gloucestershire Regiment. Service No. 15521. He was born in Horsley enlisted in Bristol and was killed in action on July 23<sup>rd</sup>.

**Private Arthur George Harris.**

5<sup>th</sup> Battalion, Gloucestershire Regiment. Service No. 4101. He was born in Nailsworth enlisted in Stroud and died of wounds on July 26<sup>th</sup> aged 19. .

**Sergeant Cyril John Worrad.**

Royal Army Ordnance Corps. He was a Dominican brother at Woodchester Priory. He died on August 6<sup>th</sup> aged 22.,

**Private Henry Charles Allway.**

1<sup>st</sup> Battalion, Gloucestershire Regiment. Service No. 10987. He was born in Horsley, enlisted in Stroud and killed in action on August 22<sup>nd</sup> aged 23

**Private John Henry (Jack) Quinn.**

1<sup>st</sup> Battalion, Gloucestershire Regiment. Service No. 19169. He worked in the Priory garden, enlisted in Bristol and killed in action on August 24<sup>th</sup> aged 20. He is buried in Caterpillar Valley Cemetery, France. He is also remembered (as Jack) on the Nailsworth War Memorial

**Private John William Hitchings.**

8<sup>th</sup> Battalion, Gloucestershire Regiment. Service No. 15236. He was born and enlisted in Stroud and killed in action on August 31<sup>st</sup> aged 34 (not 36 *as on the memorial*) in Belgium

**Private Charles E. Browning.**

3<sup>rd</sup> Battalion, Worcestershire Regiment. Service No. 29070. He was born and enlisted in Stroud and died on September 3<sup>rd</sup> aged 24

**Rifleman Francis G. Bull.**

14<sup>th</sup> Battalion Rifle Brigade. He died on September 3<sup>rd</sup> aged 21

**Private Percival Richard Horton.**

1<sup>st</sup> Battalion, Gloucestershire Regiment. Service No. 9689. He was born in Alberta, Canada enlisted in Gloucester and killed in action on September 8<sup>th</sup> aged 22. *On the memorial the date is December 8<sup>th</sup>.*

**Lance Corporal Frederick Lewis**

Bugler, 1<sup>st</sup> Battalion, Gloucestershire Regiment. Service No. 10141, also Trumpeter, Royal Glos Hussars Yeomanry. Service number 235387. *CWGC gives him as Bugler who died on August 16<sup>th</sup>. On the memorial. August 15<sup>th</sup> is given*

**Rifleman Harold Jones**

8<sup>th</sup> Battalion, (Post Office Rifles) London Regiment Service No 4278. He died September 15<sup>th</sup> aged 23

**Walter Ralph.**

1<sup>st</sup> Battalion, Canadian Mounted Rifles, Saskatchewan Regiment. Rifleman 136120. He died on September 15<sup>th</sup>, aged 24

**Rifleman Arthur Edward Smith.**

Rifle Brigade. Rifleman, S/4422. He was killed in action on September 15<sup>th</sup> aged 28.

**Lieutenant Edward S Langdale.**

This memorial has the following: Edward S Langdale Lieutenant, Royal Engineers died 14 October 1916 age 31. This name is not listed with the CWGC, UK Soldiers Died in the Great War, or the T.N.A. Medal Rolls. Instead they have the following:

*Lieutenant Edward Francis Joseph Stourton-Langdale, 233rd Field Company, Royal Engineers killed in action, 5 October 1916 age 32.*

**Private John Christopher St. George MM.**

2<sup>nd</sup> Battalion, South African Infantry. Service No. 5599 He died on October 15<sup>th</sup> aged 20

**Private Henry Essex.**

West Yorkshire Regiment. Service No 31963. He died on November 10<sup>th</sup> aged 19. He was a novice at Woodchester Priory

**Private James Henry Rothwell.**

38<sup>th</sup> Canadian Infantry, Eastern Ontario Regiment. Service No. 410186. He died on November 18<sup>th</sup> aged 22

**Private Bernard Curtis.**

8<sup>th</sup> Somerset Light Infantry. 19208, 9th Battalion He died aged 28 on 19 November 1916 .He was born at Malmesbury. *This memorial has his date of death as 19 November 1917.*

**Private E.A.G. Gabb.**

7<sup>th</sup> Battalion, Gloucestershire Regiment. Service No 10773. He came from King's Stanley. He was wounded at Gallipoli and discharged earlier in 1916. He died in Stroud on November 23<sup>rd</sup> aged 22. *Not listed with the CWGC but he can be found on the "Soldiers of Gloucestershire" web site.*

**Private William Ernest Brinkworth.**

2<sup>nd</sup>/5<sup>th</sup> Battalion, Gloucestershire Regiment. Service No. 4635. He was born in Nailsworth, enlisted in Gloucester and killed in action on December 24<sup>th</sup> aged 22.

**Lieutenant Frithoy Harold Asche.**

4<sup>th</sup> Battalion, Australian Imperial Forces. He died on January 31<sup>st</sup> aged 37.

**Lance Corporal William Philip Healey**

7<sup>th</sup> Battalion, Gloucestershire Regiment, "A" Company. Service No. 16140. He was born at Horsley enlisted in Stroud and was killed in action in Mesopotamia on February 10<sup>th</sup> aged 22

**Private Albert E. Webb.**

7<sup>th</sup> Battalion, Gloucestershire Regiment. He was born in Dursley and enlisted in Stroud. Service No. 25159. He was killed in action in Mesopotamia on February 10<sup>th</sup>, aged 21.

**Private Frank Paul.**

10<sup>th</sup> Battalion, Gloucestershire Regiment, attached to the 185<sup>th</sup> Tunnelling Company, Royal Engineers. He died on February 11<sup>th</sup> aged 34.

**Private George Brookes.**

10<sup>th</sup> Battalion, Worcestershire Regiment Service No 17285. He died on February 12<sup>th</sup> aged 26

**Private Harold Lusty.**

7<sup>th</sup> Gloucestershire Regiment. Service No. 10855. He died of his wounds on February 15<sup>th</sup>, aged 20 at Mesopotamia

**Private Nathaniel Frank Harris.**

7<sup>th</sup> Battalion, Gloucestershire Regiment. Service Number 26287. He was born and enlisted in Gloucester and killed in action in Mesopotamia on February 25<sup>th</sup> aged 22.

**Private John (Jack) Edward Porter.**

9<sup>th</sup> Battalion, Gloucestershire Regiment Service No 12810. He was born in Nailsworth and enlisted in Stroud. Service Number 12810. He was killed in action at Salonika on March 6<sup>th</sup> aged 25.

**Percy Edward Trussler**

170<sup>th</sup> Brigade, Royal Field Artillery, Driver/Signaller, service no.121144. He died on March 13<sup>th</sup> aged 24 He was the brother of Thomas who had died of his wounds on October 27<sup>th</sup> 1915, aged 21 and Albert who died four weeks later on April 10<sup>th</sup>, aged 18

**Able Seaman Wallace Theodore Chambers.**

He served on S.S. Alnwick Castle. London Mercantile Marine He died on March 17<sup>th</sup> aged 40.

**Private Henry (Harry) Francis Haines.**

12<sup>th</sup> Battalion, Gloucestershire Regiment. Service No. 17670. He was born c.1891 in Nailsworth, enlisted in Stroud and died of his wounds on March 18<sup>th</sup> aged 26.

**Private Percy Joseph Pegler**

5<sup>th</sup> Battalion, Worcestershire Regiment. He died on March 29<sup>th</sup> aged 29

**Christopher F. Nicholls.**

1/6<sup>th</sup> Battalion, Gloucestershire Regiment Service No 267577. He died on April 1<sup>st</sup> aged 20.  
"The Soldiers of Gloucestershire" "has his rank as Lance Corporal"

**Private Albert James Trussler.**

13<sup>th</sup> Royal Warwickshire Regiment, 53<sup>rd</sup> Battalion Training Reserves. Service No. TR/8/1541 He died April 10<sup>th</sup>, aged 18. He was the son of Abel Eliot and Louisa and brother of Percy and Thomas both of whom fell and are remembered on this memorial.

**Private Christopher Leonard Hobday.**

46<sup>th</sup> Battalion, Canadian Infantry, Saskatchewan Regiment. Service No. 472606. He died on April 12<sup>th</sup> aged 20,

**Gunner Frederick (Fred) John Workman**

35<sup>th</sup> Battery, 1 Canadian Field Artillery. Service No.300958. He died on May 12<sup>th</sup> aged 22

**Cecil Wilfred Griffin.**

3rd Horse Transport Company, Army Service Corps. Driver T4/249080. He died on May 26<sup>th</sup> aged 21

**Rifleman George W. Watkins.**

12<sup>th</sup> Battalion, Royal Irish Rifles Service No 42071. He died on June 2<sup>nd</sup> aged 23.

**Lieutenant John Noel Swann.**

45<sup>th</sup> Australian Infantry, Australian Imperial Forces. He died on June 7<sup>th</sup> aged 45  
*On the memorial the date given is 5<sup>th</sup> June and his age 42.*

**Bombardier Edward George Neale**

34th Division, Ammunition Col, Royal Field Artillery. Service No.89114. He was killed in action on June 7<sup>th</sup> aged 25

**Private Charles Evans.**

8<sup>th</sup> Battalion, Gloucestershire Regiment. Service No. 21412. He was born in Nailsworth and enlisted in Stroud. He was killed in action on July 9<sup>th</sup> aged 21

**2nd Lieutenant Denis J. Fendall.**

4th Squadron Royal Field Artillery, attached to the Royal Flying Corps. He was killed in action on August 7<sup>th</sup> aged 28. *On the memorial the date is given as August 17<sup>th</sup>.*

**Private Walter Brown.**

5<sup>th</sup> Battalion, Gloucestershire Regiment. Service No. 241678. He was born at Kingscourt, enlisted in Stroud and was killed in action on August 16<sup>th</sup> aged 28. *On the memorial his age is given as 29.*

**Private Albert Gainer**

2/5<sup>th</sup> Battalion, Gloucestershire Regiment. Service No. 240496. He was born at Madley, Yorkshire and enlisted in Stroud. He was killed in action on August 22<sup>nd</sup>.aged 27

**Sergeant Richard Compton Jackson, M.M.**

1st/5<sup>th</sup> Battalion, Gloucestershire Regiment, "B" Company. Service No. 240140. He was born and enlisted in Stroud and died of his wounds on August 25<sup>th</sup> aged 22 in Belgium.  
*It is not mentioned on the Wayside Cross that he is the holder of the Military Medal.*

**Private Harry Arthur Halliday.**

1/4<sup>th</sup> Battalion, Gloucestershire Regiment. Service No. 240070. Born and enlisted in Stroud and killed in action on October 2<sup>nd</sup> aged 22. *The memorial has him killed serving with the 5th..*

**Private Harry Locke.**

149<sup>th</sup> Canadian Infantry. Service No. 844722 He was wounded and lost one eye in 1915. He re-enlisted in 1917 and died on October 5<sup>th</sup>

**Private Henry B. Teakle**

1/8<sup>th</sup> Battalion, Worcestershire Regiment. Service No. 260054. He died October 10<sup>th</sup> aged 22.

**Lance Corporal Arthur Charles Ryland**

2/6<sup>th</sup> Battalion, Gloucestershire Regiment. He was born at Painswick and enlisted in Stroud. Service No. 203462. He was killed in action on October 23<sup>rd</sup> aged 28.

**Lieutenant Henry Norman Johnson**

1st/5<sup>th</sup> Battalion, Manchester Regiment. He was killed in action on November 2<sup>nd</sup> aged 23

**Private Edward Thomas Rogers.**

2nd Royal Marine Light Infantry. Service No. PLY/1957 [S] He died November 6<sup>th</sup> aged 31

**Private Albert (Bert). L.C.Chapman**

2/5<sup>th</sup> Battalion, Gloucestershire Regiment. Service No. 31420

2<sup>nd</sup> Battalion, Gloucestershire Regiment. Service No. 241632. He was killed in action on December 5<sup>th</sup> aged 22.

27<sup>th</sup> Infantry Labour Corps, King's Liverpool Regiment, transferred to 92<sup>nd</sup> Company King's Liverpool Regiment Labour Corps. He died on January 10<sup>th</sup> aged 48.

**Private Lawrence Victor Francis Clune.**

1<sup>st</sup> Battalion, Grenadier Guards Service No 27047. He died on January 29<sup>th</sup> aged 19.

**Private Harry Humphrys.**

16<sup>th</sup> Battalion, Machine Gun Corps (Infantry) Service No 43660. He died on March 21<sup>st</sup>

**Private Arthur Orchard Webb**
